





Young Hull entrepreneurs encouraged to apply for Test Market Grants



Aspiring young entrepreneurs can now apply for business grant support thanks to the John Cracknell Youth Enterprise Bank and funding from UKSP. The Youth Enterprise and Micro Business Team at Hull City Council has established the funding pot enabling the issuing of Test Market Grants between £350 and £500.

Test Market Grants are for budding businesspeople in Hull and are available until March 2025. The funding is for those aged up to 29 and who are within their first year of trading or have new business ideas. This funding is from the UK Shared Prosperity Fund courtesy of the government's Levelling Up partnership.



Cllr Paul Drake-Davis, Hull City Council's portfolio holder for economic and business regeneration, said: "The council wants to see young entrepreneurs in Hull thrive in business.

"It's brilliant that the council can support them through the John Cracknell Youth Enterprise Bank."

Successful candidates will be encouraged to mentor future young entrepreneurs in Hull and to work in promoting enterprise in schools and colleges.

Further rounds of funding will be available in October and November.

Shadow Business Secretary Visit to Hull

Business leaders ranging from major global employers to emerging entrepreneurs discussed renewables, digital development and the skills needed to drive the regeneration of the UK when they met shadow business secretary Jonathan Reynolds in Hull.

Joining them, Charles Cracknell, Hull City Council Youth Enterprise and Microbusiness Manager, along with young entrepreneurs Amanda, Danny, Erunse, Claudia and Alex at 55 Whitefriargate. Charles spoke of the importance of people who were excluded during the pandemic and of the work of the Micro Business Alliance.



He also raised the issue of late payment: "If you are giving out contracts and public money how are you going to ensure that these people pay in 30 days? If they don't will you penalise them? Including councils that don't pay within 30 days because of their processes?"

Mr Reynolds said he had discussed the matter of public revenue support for businesses during his visit to C4DI.

He added: "We will make an audit committee report on how quickly companies pay because the problem we hear time and time again is that people are afraid to

criticise businesses in public because of the strength of the business relationship.

"The public sector role in that is an absolutely fair point in terms of councils and central government. We have made late payment a fundamental part of the package we are offering to small businesses. We also want to change some of the government office rules so smaller businesses have a chance of getting some of the work."

Adrian Walker joined the MC4C programme in early June this year, and became a regular fixture in our lives, for a oh so brief time. Adrian came into the MC4C offices seeking work after stumbling across us at the May recruitment event at the DWP.

During the intro session, Adrian spoke of his previous role as a KCOM Technical Support Operator, and after 6 years he had had his fill of it and was seeking pastures new. He went on to highlight that he may not last long on the Big 13 programme as his attention span/focus was not always as it should be.



Once the sessions were up and running, Mr Walker played a full and active part with the Skills Passport and the practical tasks set out within the workshops, but his willingness to learn and share

his thoughts, ideas and opinions backed by his degree in computing led to intelligent and diverse discussions.

He breezed through the skills passport, gained the certificate, and then an opportunity to re - apply for a position at the DWP arose, one that he had recently been unsuccessful applying for. We set aside a session two days before the interview to go through possible questions, and to assist Adrian we went through his preparation process from bus timetables (working out which bus to catch) through to setting the alarm the night before.



Some 4 weeks later Adrian's as finally received the outcome and he has only gone and gained a position with them, when he came in during the week he said 'it is an ideal position, hybrid working arrangements, lots of IT work and communicating (verbally) with others. Whilst with an added bonus of one of his best friends has just started there too.

Before leaving the MC4C premises for the final time Adrian mentioned he had seen a higher-level role with his new employees advertised and spoke of his desire to get to a stage of applying for such position in the not-too-distant future.

Adrian showed effective communication, positive attitude, initiative along with organising and planning, to name but a few of the big 13 skills we promote.

He signed out, had our final firm handshake and as we saw him cross Porter Street we knew.

"Oh wow that's amazing!

Wow what an incredible amount you've raised! Well done to everyone involved, you should be very proud and we are incredibly grateful you thought of Joel.

Joel has Duchenne muscular dystrophy, a progressive muscle wasting disease that is unfortunately 100% fatal.

Joel is now almost 12 and his health is beginning to deteriorate and his body is starting to fail him, all we can do is manage his symptoms and make his life as easy as possible while making the most of the time he has. This is requiring the use of a lot of equipment, we are just starting the process of adapting our home once again to fit hoists in his room. We will also require a mobile hoist to aid lifting when we are out and about as well as portable ramps to access friends/families homes. We will hopefully soon be getting a powerchair with a riser fitted so he can be as independent as possible but which of course then needs a car to fit it in and transport him!
